I. BLESSING THE FIRE AND LIGHTING THE PASCHAL CANDLE

The priest greets the congregation: Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer.

This is the Passover of the Lord:

If we honour the memory of his death and resurrection

by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries,

then we may be confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God

The fire is blessed.

Let us pray.

Father, we share in the light of your glory through your Son, the light of the world. Make this new fire holy, and inflame us with new hope. Purify our minds by this Easter celebration and bring us one day to the feast of eternal light. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Alpha and Omega, Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age for ever.

Amen.

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us.

Amen.

The Priest lights the candle from the new fire, saying: May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

There are two further stations one in the middle of the nave and the other at the sanctuary steps. The Exsultet is then sung.

The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

My dearest friends, standing with me in this holy light, join me in asking God for mercy, that he may give his unworthy minister grace to sing his Easter praises.

It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God, the all-powerful Father, and his only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

For Christ has ransomed us with his blood, and paid for us the price of Adam's sin to our eternal Father!

This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers.

This is the night when first you saved our fathers: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea.

This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness.

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptised in your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

The priest sprinkles the people with the blessed water.

The peace follows.

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, Peace be with you! Then were they glad when they saw the Lord.

Alleluia! The peace of the risen Christ be always with you. **And also with you. Alleluia, Alleluia.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace with the following greeting:

Alleluia. The Lord is risen. **He is risen indeed. Alleluia.** *Christos anesti!* **Alithos anesti!**

To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.

O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer! Most blessed of all nights, chosen by God to see Christ rising from the dead!

Of this night scripture says: 'The night will be as clear as day: it will become my light, my joy.'

The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy; it casts out hatred, brings us peace, and humbles earthly pride. Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and man is reconciled with God!

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering.

Accept this Easter candle, a flame divided but undimmed, a pillar of fire that glows to the honour of God.

Let it mingle with the lights of heaven and continue bravely burning to dispel the darkness of this night!

May the Morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning:
Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Amen.

II. THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Dear friends in Christ, we have begun our solemn vigil. Let us now listen attentively to the word of God, recalling how he saved his people throughout history and, in the fullness of time, sent his own Son to be our Redeemer. Through this Easter celebration, may God bring to perfection the saving work he has begun in us.

The vigil readings follow. The choir or a cantor leads the Psalm and the people respond. Then the priest stands and says the collect.

READINGS

1. GENESIS 1.1-5, 1.26-2.2 (The Creation)

Psalm 33.1-9

Response: The earth is filled with the loving kindness of the Lord.

2. GENESIS 3.8-13, 22-24 (The Fall)

Psalm 130

Response: With the Lord there is mercy.

3. GENESIS 7, 8, and 9 (The Flood)

Psalm 46

Response: The Lord of hosts is with us.

4. GENESIS 22.1-18 (The Binding of Isaac)

Psalm 16.8-end

Response: In your presence is the fullness of joy.

5. EXODUS 14:10–15:1a (The Crossing of the Red Sea)

The Song of Moses and Miriam

Response: Sing to the Lord, for he has won a glorious victory.

After the last reading with its responsory and prayer, the altar lights are lit, the Gloria is sung and hand bells are rung.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

May almighty God who has given you the desire to follow Christ Give you the strength to continue in the way.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

With the help of God, I will.

Dear friends in Christ, let us ask God, the Almighty Father, to bless this font that those reborn in it may be made one with his adopted children in Christ.

Father, you give us grace through sacramental signs, which tell us of the wonders of your unseen power. In baptism we use your gift of water, which you have made a rich symbol of the grace you give us in this sacrament. At the very dawn of creation your Spirit breathed on the waters, making them the wellspring of all holiness. The waters of the great flood you made a sign of the waters of baptism, that make an end of sin and a new beginning of goodness. Through the waters of the Red Sea You led Israel out of slavery, to be an image of God's holy people, set free from sin by baptism. In the waters of the Jordan Your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. Your Son willed that water and blood should flow from his side as he hung upon the cross. After his resurrection he told his disciples: 'Go out and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' Father, look now with love upon your Church, and unseal for her the fountain of baptism. By the power of the Spirit give to the water of this font the grace of your Son. You created man in your own likeness: cleanse him from sin in a new birth of innocence by water and the Spirit. We ask you, Father, with your Son to send the Holy Spirit upon the waters of this font. May all who are buried with Christ

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, Almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen

THE COLLECT

Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new to him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity.
