Holy Communion from the Common Cup

The common cup has been restored symbolizing our unity in Christ. Note this is the **common cup**. Intinction (*dipping the bread into the wine*) is <u>NOT</u> **permitted for hygienic reasons and as directed by the bishops.** If you feel uncertain about drinking from the chalice continuing to receive the bread only is acceptable. Remain kneeling until the wine has passed to acknowledge the presence of Christ in both the bread and the wine. Should you have an active respiratory infection of any sort, we ask that you exercise caution and refrain from the cup.
