Masks, the Common Cup and Collections

By God's grace, we have reached another turning point in this pandemic. On Sunday 22 May, the common cup was restored. It symbolises our unity in Christ. We no longer require masks to be worn during the service. Note this is the **common cup**. Intinction (dipping the bread into the wine) is no longer possible for hygienic reasons and as directed by the bishops. If you feel uncertain about drinking from the chalice continuing to receive the bread only is perfectly acceptable. Leave the altar rail once the person on your right has received or the cup bearer has moved to the next but one person. It is good to acknowledge the cup and Christ's presence in the bread and the wine. Should you have an active respiratory infection of any sort, we ask that you exercise caution and refrain from the common cup.

We will also began taking up a collection according to our earlier practice. There is now a card reader in church for people to make donations electronically.

If you would like to continue to wear a mask please do. Our principle throughout the pandemic was and is to ensure that as many people as possible can worship in church in good conscience. Except for the first lockdown, we have held regular services in church and on most Sundays, three services.
