The common cup has been restored symbolizing our unity in Christ. Note this is the common cup. Intinction (dipping the bread into the wine) is NOT permitted for hygienic reasons and as directed by our bishops. If you feel uncertain about drinking from the chalice, continuing to receive the bread only is acceptable. Remain kneeling until the wine has passed. Should you have an active respiratory infection of any sort, we ask that you exercise caution and refrain from the cup.
